

2. Voices from dark days

Exodus 1:1-2:10

- How do we live when days of darkness come?
- 4 voices/conclusions come out of the events of this chapter

1. Pharaoh - The Voice of Power

- Egyptians believed Pharaoh was a god this is a clash of the Gods
- Pharaoh tries three methods to limit the growing nation of Israel
- v7, 12, 20 they keep on growing in spite/because of the oppression
- v17 thwarted by the midwives "they feared God"
- v23 Enlists help of Nile god but (2:6) thwarted by his own daughter
- Thwarted at every turn, by some power working behind the scenes

Pharaoh - "There is a power much greater than me"

2. Satan - The Voice of Evil

- Evil doesn't simply come from inside people, but outside also
- Bible speaks of a dark evil being behind all human evil Satan
- Gen 3, Rev 12 Satan wants to destroy the promised child before it gets him
- Bible marked by attacks on children Cain/Abel, Egypt, Bethlehem
- Satan's two great aims: to destroy people, to destroy his destroyer
- He too is thwarted (and mocked) at every turn

Satan – "There is a God who is determined to rescue people for himself"

3. Israelites - The Voice of the Hurting

- Where is God? Why is he silent? No answers, just promises kept
- Promised they'd go to Egypt (Gen 46:3), for 400 years, as slaves (Gen 15:13,14), become a great nation (Gen 15:5, 17:6), and leave (Gen 15:14)
- We live by faith in his promises, not by sight.
- God is faithful amidst the silence. Hang on to his promises

Israel – "You can trust God's faithfulness amidst the dark silences"

4. The Voice of Hope – Jochebed (Moses' mother)

- Was Jochebed's hope based on her circumstances turning out nicely?
- God doesn't promise that he will avert every tragedy for the Christian
- She was still a slave. Her hope lies in a rescue through the miracle child

Jochebed – "Place your hope in God's rescuer, not in your circumstances being changed"

- God's solution to suffering isn't simply to mop up the problems, but to step into the suffering so that he can bring an end to it.
- In Jesus, God comes and suffers so that he can deal with root of evil, both in us and outside of us. This is where our hope lies.
