

1. The Supremacy of God's Power

- Chp 7-11 are about a clash between the gods of Egypt and the true God
- God underlines his supremacy over and over again:
 - Nature concedes to God – timing (eg. 7:19, 8:10), location (8:22)
 - Magicians concede to God – only able to copy, not undo
 - Egypt's 'gods' concede to God – plagues are a systematic attack on Egyptian beliefs. From Hapi (Nile god), to gods of crops, animals and healing, to Amon-Re (Sun god) – all fail to withstand the Lord.
- Where does our trust lie? Abilities, savings, family? Does God need to dismantle a few of the things we trust in?

2. The Folly of our Sin

- Egyptians concede too (9:20, 10:7), but not stubborn Pharaoh
- 4 characteristics of stubborn foolish rebels:
 - Choose to ignore instead of listening
 - More concerned about consequences of sin than sin itself - (9:27)
 - Think they can bargain with God about obedience – (9:25,28, 10:10)
 - Ultimately shoot themselves in the foot – (10:28)

3. The Terror of God's Judgment

- Pharaoh heart is hard (7:13, 22; 8:19; 9:35); hardens his heart (8:15,32; 9:34); God hardens it (4:21; 7:3; 10:1,20,27; 11:10)
- For Pharaoh it is too late – the plagues aren't simply warnings, they are judgment on his previous godless attitude.
- You don't toy with this God's mercy, or trample his word. He will not be patient forever. *"Therefore God has mercy on whom he wants to have mercy, and he hardens whom he wants to harden"* (Romans 9:18)
- The clash of the gods is ultimately a clash between me and God – who will rule my life? There will only be one winner

4. The Security of God's people

- However there is a God who will move Heaven and Earth to save people
- From 4th plague there is a distinction – protection amidst judgment
- Not saying Christians are free from trouble, but that they are spared God's ultimate judgments
- 8:23 – "I will put 'redemption' between my people and your people"
- God has come to redeem his people – on one side there is judgment, on the other there is life. In between is God.
- A great picture of Christ taking the judgment, providing life, protection and security for all who come to him.
