7. The God who Judges

Exodus 11-13

• In a world of injustice we want justice, but people dislike the idea of God as judge

1. A just God must bring judgment

- Two things to remember before you think about judgment
 - God's patience before judging Egypt had 400 years
 - God's many warnings before judging 9 plagues, also Ex 4:23
 - a) It doesn't matter what you believe in God will judge
 - Pharaoh and son were meant to be sons of the god of life and death
 - Once again the beliefs of the Egyptians are shown to be empty
 - There is only one God, and all people must appear before him, no matter what they believe
 - b) It doesn't matter who you are God will judge
 - Status doesn't matter both prince and pauper 11:5
 - A hard life doesn't grant an exception from judgment
 - A religious life doesn't exempt the Destroyer also visits Israel (12:23)
- "Those who will not bow to God's word must bend before his judgment" Alec Motyer
- God's judgment is an awful reality, pictured for us here in miniature
- Judgment is not random or excessive, but the awful consequence of denying God our lives

2. A merciful God offers to bear judgment

- Between prediction and fulfilment of judgment is instruction about escape
- Escape is by substitution a perfect lamb is to die in the place of each family
- All is pointing forward to Jesus, the ultimate Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29)
- At the Cross, the God who judges takes judgment on himself!
- If we accept Jesus' death for our sins, God will Passover us
- When judgment seems unutterably awful to us, we must look at the cross, and see the staggering mercy of God

3. A gracious God gives riches in the place of judgment

- Israel leave laden with treasure on their way to freedom (12:35-36)
- Mercy: not getting what we deserve. Grace: getting what we couldn't deserve
- God's rescue is a glorious rich freedom, pictured here in miniature
- The Christian gets so much more than forgiveness Heaven, adopted, changed, strengthened, equipped, and most of all we get God.
- God may be a judge, but with him is an unparalleled mercy, and a glorious generosity
