### 1. Mortification seeks to kill the enemy within

- 3 enemies the world, the flesh & the Devil (Eph 2:1-2)
- Mortification is an internal war against the flesh.
- Flesh = ourselves our old habits & sinful ways (Rom 6:6)
- Not just killing sins, but killing sin the principles which drive it
- Look for the sin beneath the sin Ask yourself why do I do that?
- Why does this mean more to me than Jesus?
