Reading: Genesis 12:1-9 2 Sam 7:1-11 1 Kings 8:56-61

The Big Idea: Throughout the Old Testament God uses Israel as a picture of what his kingdom is like.

The building of a Kingdom

- Gen 12-Ex18 God builds a people, rescuing them from slavery in process
- Ex 19-Leviticus God give them his rules
- Num-Joshua God brings them into a place prepared for them
- Judges-1 Kings 10 God's people, in God's place, under Gods's rule, enjoying God's blessing

Characteristics of the Kingdom

No change from Old Testament to New Testament

Entered through God's Saving Grace

- Abraham, all the children of Israel became God's people because of what God did, not because of what they had done.
- We can be part of God's Kingdom only when we accept what Jesus has done for us Titus 3:5

Forgiven because of a substitute

- Passover Lamb, sacrifices, Day of Atonement. Death is required for sin.
- All pointing forard to the great substitute "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29)

Lived in by Obedience

• Salvation first (Exodus), then obedience (10 Coms) as a response.

Blessed by God

- Blessed by God's presence with them temple, Ark of Covenant
 - o Jesus says, "I am with you always" (Matt 28:20)
- Blessed by God's provision for them manna, land flowing with...
 - Jesus says, "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matt 6:33)
- Blessed with victories in God's strength
 - o "I can do all things through him who gives me strength" (Phil 4:13)
