# JACOB

# 1. Trusting the Sovereign Lord

Genesis 25:19-28

- The bad news Jacob was a messed up twisted man
- The good news God delights to call himself 'The God of Jacob'
- There is hope for everyone because God loves to rescue 'Jacobs'

#### 1. Difficulties are part of the Christian life v21-22

- The promise given to Abraham of numerous descendants was to be fulfilled through Isaac
- Rebekah was barren for nearly 20 years usually a cause of great shame
- Dashed hopes Gen 24:60. Joy at pregnancy overshadowed v22
- Blessings bring their own trials doesn't mean God has abandoned us
- God warns us to expect trials for they strengthen us James 1:2-4

## 2. Dependence is the key to the Christian life v21-22

- "The life I live, I live by faith' Gal 2:20
- A faith that can't be tested can't be trusted
- Isaac and Rebekah trusted God rather than find their own solution
- Isaac pleaded with God for his wife v21
- Rebekah took her troubles to God v22
- We need to grasp our utter dependence on God
- Our dependence is measured by our prayer life

#### 3. He can be trusted because he is sovereign v23

- God decrees who will be the one in charge, he decrees two nations
- His choice isn't based on the performance of either, but on mercy & love
- A warning we are not accepted because of our performance
- Hope anyone can ask God to choose them
- Comfort in the barren desolate moments God is still sovereign, and looks on your in love and mercy not on your performance

### 4. He can be trusted because he keeps his word v24-26

- God kept his word given to Abraham 57 years previously Gen 21:12
- No matter how long you wait, God keeps his word
- No matter how impossible his promise seems, he keeps his word
- Signposts to Jesus
  - You can trust God because Jesus went through ultimate barrenness (forsakenness) so that we would never be forsaken
  - Before you were born God set his love on you & decreed that the older brother (Jesus) should serve the younger (us) – on the cross
- v27-28 our Father is the true and perfect father who doesn't favour one of his children above others, but loves all equally
- That's why he can be trusted amidst the barren patches of life
