- Problem is not planning, but overconfident planning without God v13.
- James has 3 needles to burst independent planning

1. Life is unpredictable – so hold your plans loosely

- v13 'business" God is to be involved in all our lives/plans/dreams/ambitions
- Needle 1 "You don't even know about tomorrow" v14
 - We need to humbly remember the uncertainty of life
 - Sounds like his brother Jesus Luke 12:16-20
