

- On a global scale, we're rich
- However James' main aim is to encourage struggling Christians
- He's not condemning wealth in and of itself but the misuse of it

1. Don't let wealth blind you to true riches (vs 1-3a)

a. It blinds the rich

- v1 is completely opposite to the world's way of thinking it thinks that the rich are those who have made it.
- These rich people are blind because they don't have the one treasure that really matters: Jesus

b. It blinds the rest of us

- The danger of always wanting just a bit more
- The reason this passage is here is so that we wouldn't envy the rich.

2. Don't let wealth blind you to true priorities (vs 3, 5)

- Rich people not being condemned for being rich, but for not being good stewards of God's money.
- They have laid up ('hoarded') treasure on earth not in Heaven.
- A life of luxury and self-indulgence doesn't result in the self-denial Jesus demands
- There's a place for saving but don't let it become your security.
- Don't fatten yourself in a day of slaughter use money for gospel purposes

3. Don't let wealth blind you to others' need (vs 4a, 6)

- Just like today, those with money and power were able to exploit those under them
- Are we honest when we sell things and do we pay what we owe?
- Affluence or the desire for it opens the door to carelessness and insensitivity to what is both due to and needed by others.

4. Don't let wealth blind you to Jesus (vs 4b, 6)

- To mess with Jesus' people is to mess with Jesus.
- If suffering at the hands of others remember your big brother's coming.
- v6 ultimately speaks of Jesus
- He came to rescue us from the need to desperately chase after what we don't have or to cling to what we do.
- Because of him we can live for things that will still matter in 1000 years.
