

16. Christ is enough

Philippians 3:1-9

- 1. Christ doesn't need added to v1-3
- Circumcision Jewish religious rite being brought into Christianity
- Circumcision would also give Christianity protection under Judaism
- Teachers teaching that you need Jesus + circumcision
- Paul furious because Jesus is enough; additions become our trust
- Paul furious because adding to Jesus work jeopardises salvation
- Marks of true Christians (v3) worship without external ritual; delight in Jesus; confidence not in our performance, but Christ
- We mustn't add to Jesus even for cultural safety

2. Christ outweighs all else – v4-8

a) Christ outweighs our best efforts

- "Whatever was to my profit I now consider loss"
- All of Paul's colossal heritage counts for nothing
- All of his religious efforts took him further into debt
- Awful realisation that his efforts were 'dung' ('rubbish')
- \circ $\,$ We need the richness of Christ and his work to get us into Heaven

b) Christ offsets our worst loses

- "For whose sake I have lost everything"
- Paul's earthly ambitions were destroyed but not bitter
- For Paul, Christ outsets even the hardest circumstances
- Following Christ may mean we lose out
- \circ $\$ We need to look at what we get, not what we lose
- The key to starting *and living* the Christian life is to see that Christ is far more valuable and necessary than anything else
- Keeps us from falling into temptation, pride, or resentment
- Our backgrounds allow people to see that Christ is worth more than the best, and outweighs the worst

3. Keep your focus on the richness of Christ – v9

- "compared to the surpassing greatness of Christ Jesus my Lord"
- He gives us himself "That I may gain Christ"
- He gives us eternal security "being found in him"
- He gives us acceptance with God "having a righteousness from God"
- He gives the most and asks the least "and is by faith"
- *"Rejoice in the Lord"* Joy comes from keeping our eye on the prize, on Christ
- The more we see him, the less brightly will shine the lights of this world
