Philippians 22. The Secret of Contentment a life/shaped by the gospel Philippians 4:10-23

1. The Possibility of Contentment

- 2 things can corrode it: BOTH having & not having (v12)
- Not his natural tendency, not stoicism, not complacent
- Paul is in deeply trying circumstances but says contentment is possible
- Contentment should be like a thermostat not a thermometer

2. The Source of Contentment

• "in Him" - Contentment is rooted in God, not in circumstances

a) Contentment in a Strength-giving Saviour (v13)

- "I have strength to do all things through him who gives me strength"
- We need to look for his strength as much on good days as bad days

b) Contentment in a Generous God (v19)

- "... according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus"
- \circ $\;$ At the cross Christ purchased all we need for all our needs
- \circ $\;$ We can face the future because we know God will provide

c) Contentment in a Glorious Father (v20)

- "To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever"
- Not just 'God' but 'Father' he cares deeply
- God's glory is tied to his providing for his people

d) Contentment in a Sovereign Lord (v22)

- "all the saints... especially those who belong to Caesar's household"
- Remember who is in charge He can do what seems impossible
- Jesus changes everything he brings strength, victory, riches, belonging
- Christians have the greatest prize we need to live like it

3. The Discipline of Contentment

- "*I have learned*" v11,12: Every incident is a chance to learn & re-inforce
- The discipline of not looking coveting/complaining/comparing
- The discipline of looking always at God, and what he has for us
- The discipline of trusting *"Faith sucks the honey of contentment from the hive of the promise"* (Thomas Watson)

4. The Outworking of Contentment

- Genuine Gratitude Paul is thanking, not hinting. Thankless people look for more, thankful people realise what they have
- Generous Giving Philippians gave out of poverty (but rich in trust in God). Christians can be generous because they have a God who gives
- The fruit of contentment also feed contentment
- Where does your contentment lie?
