

7. The Fellowship of the King

Philippians 1:3-8

• In a fragmented world, the church is to be God's model community

1. Paul's attitude to God's people

a) Thankfulness to God for the Philippians v3

- Thankful because of their partnership in God's work (v5)
 - o 'partnership' they rolled up their sleeves and worked alongside Paul in advancing the gospel
- Thankful because of God's work in them (v6)
 - o Paul was delighted to see their growth and progress
 - o Delighted because God is changing and guarding them

b) Prayer to God for the Philippians v4

- Who and what we pray for reveals what matters to us
- Paul is in prison, yet he is pre-occupied with others
- Paul prays regularly, and persistently for these Christians (v4)
- Paul prays specifically for their spiritual welfare (v9-11)

c) Love for the Philippians v7-8

- Love for fellow Christians is evidence of salvation (1 John 3:14)
- We are to care deeply about those whom Christ cares deeply for
- Their concerns, welfare and progress should concern us
- Such love is to find ways of expressing itself

2. Paul's attitude is modelled on Christ's attitude

a) Christ is thankful to the Father for all his people

- o John 17:2, Ps 2:8: believers are a gift to the Son from the Father
- o Hebrews 2:11,13, Psalm 16:3 refer to his delight in us
- Your Saviour thanks/praises his Father for you

b) Christ prays to the Father for all his people

- o If we are believers then we have Christ interceding for us
- o John 17:20-26, Romans 8:34, Hebrews 7:25

c) Christ delights in and loves all his people

- o "with the affection of Christ Jesus" v8
- o The Christian is brought into a staggering relationship
- o "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you" John 15:9

3. What is our attitude?

- God is building a new community will we play our role in it?
- Will we delight in fellow Christians as those in whom God is working?
- Will we pray regularly and specifically?
- Will we demonstrate selfless love and concern to them?
