

9. Happiness in Christ, not Circumstances Philippians 1:12-18

• What makes you tick? What happens when your hopes don't happen?

1. Ground your happiness in Christ, not your circumstances

- Paul: nearly lynched, unjustly imprisoned, slandered by Christians
- His response? v18 "I rejoice" How?

a) Live for Christ's glory not your comfort/reputation etc

- o v12, 18, 20 Paul cares most for Christ's cause not his own
- o Paul grasped that our lives aren't to be about us, but about God
- To grasp this you need to have experienced that Christ didn't live first for his own comfort or reputation, but yours
- A Christian sees what Christ has done and wants people to know

b) See every circumstance as an opportunity to bring Christ glory

- o Didn't grumble or become focused on immediate task
- o Paul sees his prison as a pulpit, his chains as communication cords
- o How else could God get the gospel to the Roman legions?
- o Challenge: Will we see where God has placed us, or how God has made us as the canvas on which he paints his masterpiece?

2. Happiness in Christ brings fruitful joy in our circumstances

• 4 things happen when Christians make Christ their joy:

a) The lost are reached

- o "it has become clear throughout the palace guard" v13
- The Christian is to live in such a way that everyone can see that nothing matters more than Jesus
- O When we do, people come to trust Jesus for themselves

b) Christians are encouraged

- o "most of my brothers have been encouraged..." v14
- Others read the truths of the gospel in our lives and are spurred on

c) Other Christians are seen as brothers, despite differences

- o "What does it matter... Christ is being preached" v18
- o v15-17: Genuine Christians preaching with wrong motives
- o Paul more focused on the gospel than building his own 'kingdom'
- Focusing on Christ's kingdom lets us rejoice in other Christians

d) Help in hard circumstances

- o "in chains... I continue to rejoice" v13,18
- Whatever our chains are, focusing on Christ and his agenda gives a purpose to everything & loosens our grasp on other things
- We can trust Christ's purposes even when we don't yet understand
