

8. Mary - Steady amidst great trials

Luke 1:26-38, 46-56; 2:16-52; Mark 3:20,31-35; John 19:25-27

Mary - A Call to a Hard Life

- About 14-15 yrs old, engaged, extremely conservative society
- A hard year (pre-birth): Life turned upside-down Shame? Divorce? Fears?
- The hard years: raising Jesus, losing him for 3 days, Joseph dies(?)
- The harder years: 3 years of Jesus' ministry what is he doing?
- The hardest day: watching your son executed
- "Greetings, you who are *highly favoured*"????
- God's blessings do not always look like blessings
- God sometimes calls his people to live for him in hard circumstances

2. Mary - A God-centred Life

a) You need to know yourself well enough to know you need God

- o "Without knowledge self, we cannot know God" John Calvin
- o Mary knows that she is a sinner who needs a saviour (Luke 1:47, 2:32)

b) You need to know God well enough to trust him

- O Doesn't spill the problems, instead displays trust in God
- O Luke 1:46-55 Her prayer is full of God's praise
- Not blind acceptance prayer reveals she knows the God she trusts
- \circ Also she pondered God's dealings with her fed her trust (Lk 2:19, 51)
- o Knowing God's character enabled her to trust him in hard circumstances

c) You need to value God well enough to want to serve him

- o Luke 1:38 "I am the Lord's servant."
- o She puts God first, above her honour, comfort, goals, understanding
- o Can only do that if you value God more than anything else
- o Need a high view of God and a humble view of self
- o Get that at the cross. Are you putting God first?

3. Mary - A God-blessed Life

a) You will see God provide

- o God stepped in and transformed Mary's circumstances eg Joseph
- o Many perplexing things, many fears about future, but God provides
- $\circ\quad$ The blessing of seeing God provide comes when we trust him, not before

b) You will see God work through you

- o Who would have picked Mary for this task only God
- o God uses ordinary people who trust & value him for an extraordinary impact
- o As Mary trusted & did very ordinary things, God was at work
 - Great encouragement to parents, to all of us
- "Often God means to use us for his glory in the most ordinary of circumstances" Lydia Brownback "Legacy of Faith"
