7. When we need a perfect Father

- Fatherhood designed to be a picture of God a challenge to parents
- He is the ultimate Father we all need, and long for

1. A Father who understands our frailty & still loves us - v13-14

- a) He loves his kids deeply 'As a Father has compassion..."
- "compassion' = a deep emotion, see Is 49:15
- He is not distant or unaffected, but close and intimate
- b) He understands his kids' frailty 'for he remembers we are dust'
- o Doesn't love us because we are gifted, but because we are broken
- o 'He knows our frame' doesn't ask what we can't give
- o When we fail, he doesn't stop loving his children

2. A Father who is compassionate enough to get angry – v8-10

- Two ways to destroy children Too angry/Never angry
- We need a father who loves us enough to get angry when we do wrong
- His anger is real, but under control, temporary, and for our good
- We need to learn from his anger it always has the purpose of growth

3. A Father who acts in grace to rescue and transform – v1-7

- Sometimes it is outside a father's power to help but not this one
- He has the passion and power to rescue and transform his kids
- His heart isn't motivated by our abilities, but by his grace
- v2-5: 4 pairs of blessings 1st in each is present, 2nd is present and future
- He doesn't hold our sin over us, he forgives & transforms until we are home

4. A Father who provides an everlasting home v15-17

- Man is quickly forgot, but not by God
- No place left on earth, but God provides an everlasting place

5. A Father who cares for his children's children v17-18

- The children of believers have a special place in God's heart
- They enjoy special privileges Baptism is a mark of God's blessing
- Doesn't make child a Christian, but encourages parents to be faithful and trust God to keep his word. Immense comfort in an uncertain world

Applications

- Fathers what portrait of God are we painting for our children?
- How do we enjoy this fatherly care? Need to accept God's terms (v18).
 - o It took the Son to take our sins so we could become sons/daughters
 - O We need to ask the Son (Jesus) to make us acceptable to the Father
- Christians: Our problems come from forgetting the benefits of having God as a Father.
 - We need to work hard at delighting in this truth
